Yellow or white	10" x 10" square
Navy	12 ½" x 12 ½" square
Burgundy	Scrap
Dark Purple	Scraps
Medium Purple	Scraps
Light Purple	Scraps
Black	2 ½" x 12 ½" strip

Star Block

Make four (4) $2 \times 3 \frac{1}{2}$ " flying geese using the No Waste Method.
A Reference Guide is on page 4.

You will use a navy $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " square and four (4) yellow $2 \frac{3}{4}$ " squares.

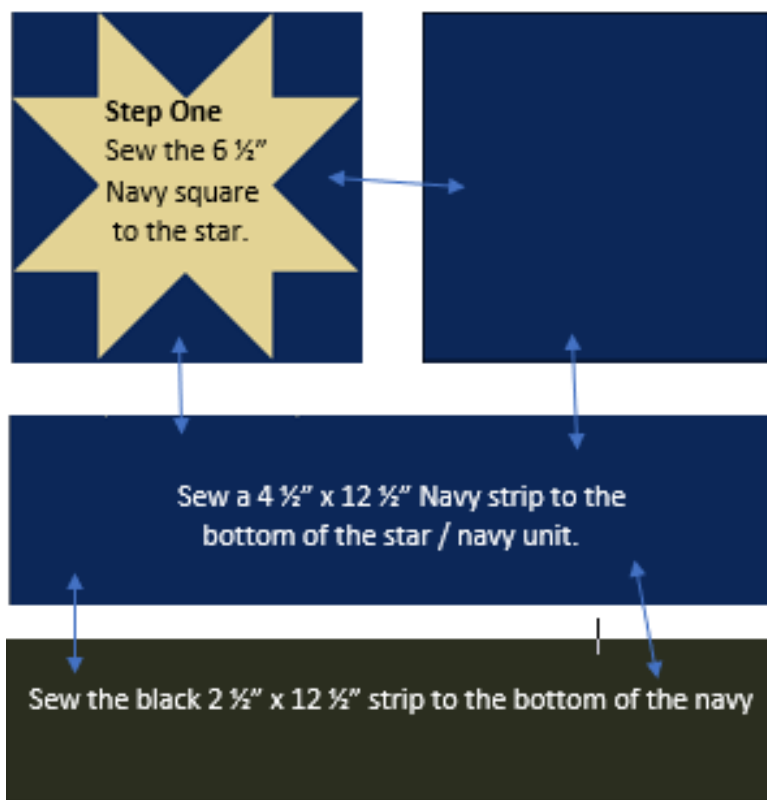
2. On two of the flying geese units sew one $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " navy squares to each end.



3. Sew a flying geese unit to the ____" yellow square on opposite sides.



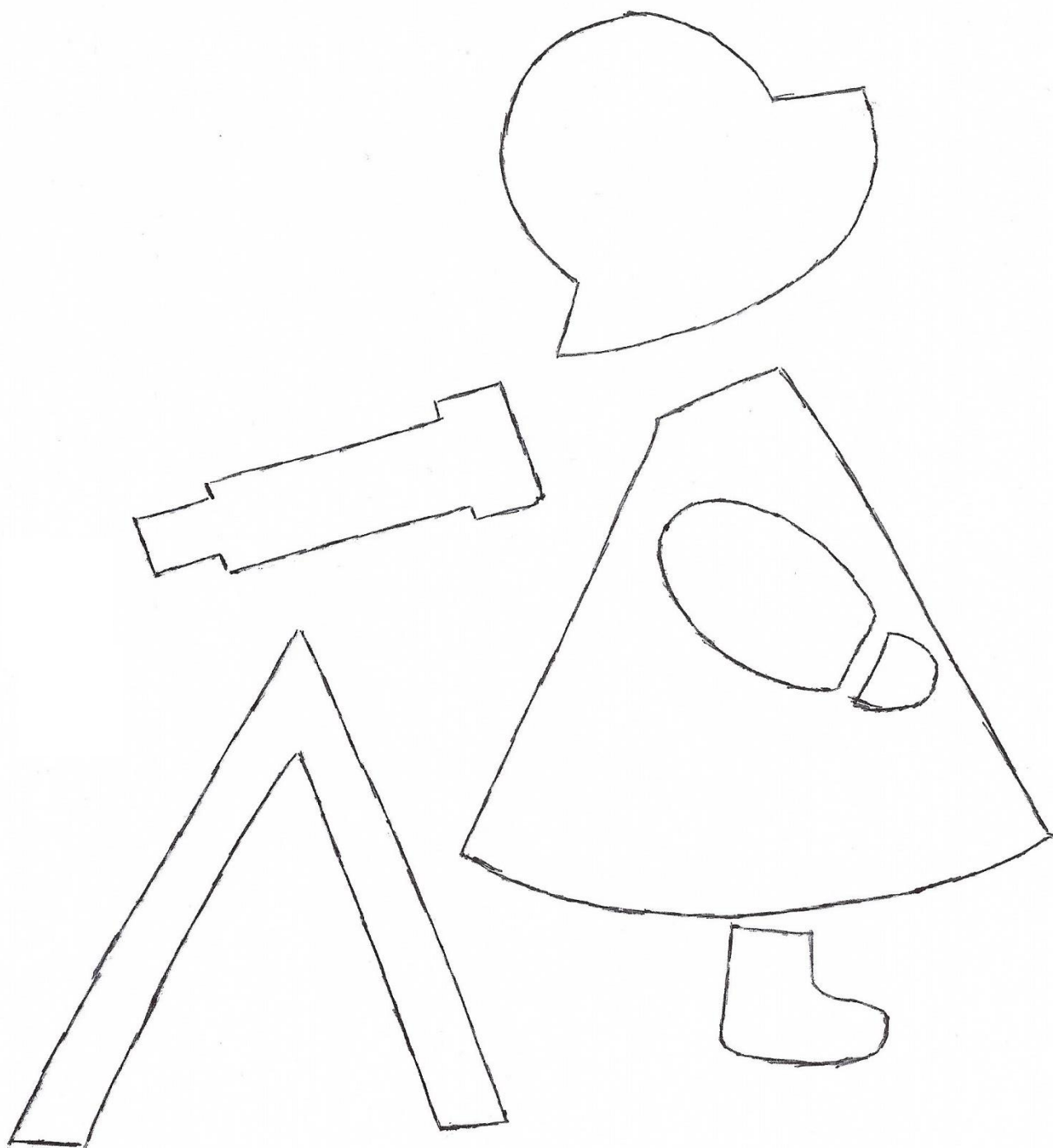
4. Join the strips from Step 2 to the top and bottom of the Step 3 unit.

**Assembly**

Assemble the $12 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $12 \frac{1}{2}$ " block as pictured.

Sunbonnet Sue:

1. Use the directions on the fusible web packaging to adhere the fabric for Sue and the telescope.
2. Cut the pieces out and iron onto the 12 ½" x 12 ½" block. Stitch the blocks down for added security.

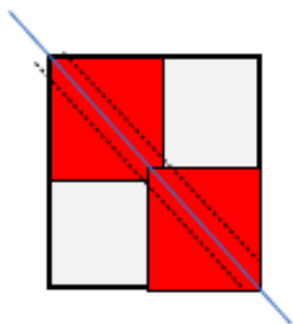


No Waste Flying Geese Reference Guide

The No Waste Flying Geese method allows you to make four flying geese at once. It leaves minimal waste and accurate geese.

You will need:

- Marking tool
- Ruler
- Well pressed fabric
- Rotary cutter & mat

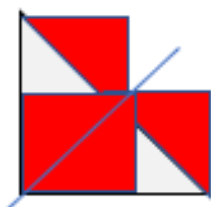


Place two small squares on top the large square of fabric in opposite corners. The center point will overlap $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Pin into place. Draw a diagonal line through the center of the small blocks. Stitch scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the line. Cut the square in half on the drawn line.

Press open.



After pressing open, you will have two units as pictured.



Place a red square on the corner, the draw a line from corner to center of triangle pieces.

Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the line.

Cut on the drawn line and press open. Repeat on the second unit.



Refer to pattern directions for square sizes.
