
Read all of the instructions first.

Trace the templates onto the paper side of light fusible web. Rough cut the pieces apart. Lay the pieces on the back of the appropriate fabric and fuse according to manufacturer directions. Cut out on the drawn lines. Arrange the pieces to your satisfaction on the background 12 ½" x 12 ½" block. Following the manufacturer directions, fuse the fabric pieces to the background.

Secure the pieces down by stitching on the outside edge of the pieces. You can use a regular running stitch or try your hand at embroidery stitches such as the blanket, backstitch or vine stitch.

Optional: If you are going to make the Sunbonnet Quilt (a block of the month quilt via Quilt Block Mania), sew the border to the $12 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $12 \frac{1}{2}$ " block prior to appliqueing.


For the border you will need two (2) 2 %" x 12 %" and two (2) 2 %" x 16 %" strips of fabric which coordinates with the block. Sew the 2 % x 12 %" strips onto the sides of the quilt block, press as desired. Sew the 2 %" x 16 %" strips to the top and bottom of the block. The block now measures 16 %" x 16 %".




Airplane

- 1. Print then trim Part A and Part B of the Airplane foundation paper. Use the airplane fabrics for the shaded areas and the sky-blue fabric on the white space.
- 2. Sew Part A starting with number 1 and working numerically through 5.
- 3. Sew Part B starting with number 6 and working numerically through number 8.
- 4. Trim the parts on the dotted lines and then join piece A and B together. Remove foundation paper and press. Airplane

measures 4 1/4" x 4 1/4"





Block Assembly

1. From the <u>sky-blue</u> fabric cut one 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strip and one 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strip. To make the window sew the 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strip to the left side of the airplane and the 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strip to the right. Press the unit open. The window measures 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".



2. From fabric <u>Wall A</u> cut: two (2) 2 ½" x 4 ¼" strips and one (1) 3 ¼" x 12 ½" strip.

Note: If using directional <u>Wall A</u> fabric, cut the two 2 ½" x 4 ¼" strips vertically and the 3 ¼" x 12 ½" strip horizontally.



Sew one 2 %" x 4" strip to the left and right side of the window. Press. The window unit will measure 4 %" x 12 %"


Attach the 3 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strip to the top of the window unit. Press. Unit measures 7" x 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".





3. Sew the Wall B 1" x 12 %" fabric strip to the bottom of the unit from Step 2. Press. The section measures 7 %" x 12 %"

4. Join the Wall C 3 ½" x 12 ½" fabric to the bottom of the Step 3. The unit measures 10 ½"






5. Sew the Floor 2 %" x 12 %" to the bottom of step 4 unit. Press. The block measures 12 %" x 12 %"

5. Position and applique pieces on the block as shown in the cover page image.

Bonus

- 1. If using the "International Airport" sign, print onto fabric and heat set. Trim to desired size and applique.
- 2. Applique the luggage pieces.
