



| Color A | One (1) 8 ½" x 12 ½" |

| Color C | Scraps |
| Color D | Scraps |
| Color F | One (1) 4 ½" x 12 ½" |

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1. Sew together Fabric A and Fabric F, resulting in a 12 $\frac{12}{12}$ x 12 $\frac{12}{12}$ square.



Optional: If you are going to make the Sunbonnet Quilt (a block of the month quilt via Quilt Block Mania), sew the border on the 12 %" x 12 %" block prior to appliqueing.

For the border you will need two (2) 2 %"x 12 %" and two (2) 2 %" x 16 %" strips of fabric coordinating with the block. Sew the 2 % x 12 %" strips onto the sides of the quilt block, press as desired. Sew the 2 %" x 16 %" strips to the top and bottom of the block. The quilt block now measures 16 %" x 16 %".

- 2. Cut out the applique pieces. Add a quarter inch if you desire to turn the edges under. If you are using fusible webbing, follow the package instructions. When printing the templates, make sure to print at 100% not "fit to page."
- 3. Place the pieces on the 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " block and adhere in proper places. The best order of application is as follows:
- 1) Skirt Piece A
- 2) Hand
- 3) Blouse
- 4) Skirt Piece B
- 5) Bonnet
- 4) Using either a lazy daisy or French knot embroider flowers on the "grass". Add a stem using either a backstitch or stem stitch.

Optional: Instead of embroidering flowers, fussy cut flowers from fabric and adhere using fusible webbing.
