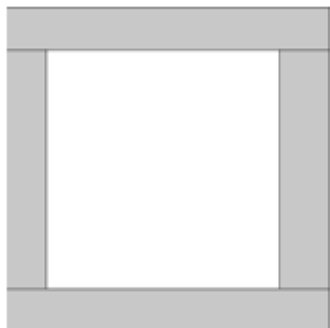
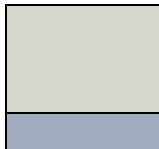


Color A	One (1) 10 ½" x 12 ½"
Color B	One (1) 2 ½" x 12 ½"
Color C	Scraps
Color D	Scraps
Color E	Scraps

Read all of the instructions first.

When printing templates, make sure the printer is set at 100% not “fit to page.”

1. Sew together Fabric A and Fabric B, resulting in a 12 ½” x 12 ½” square.



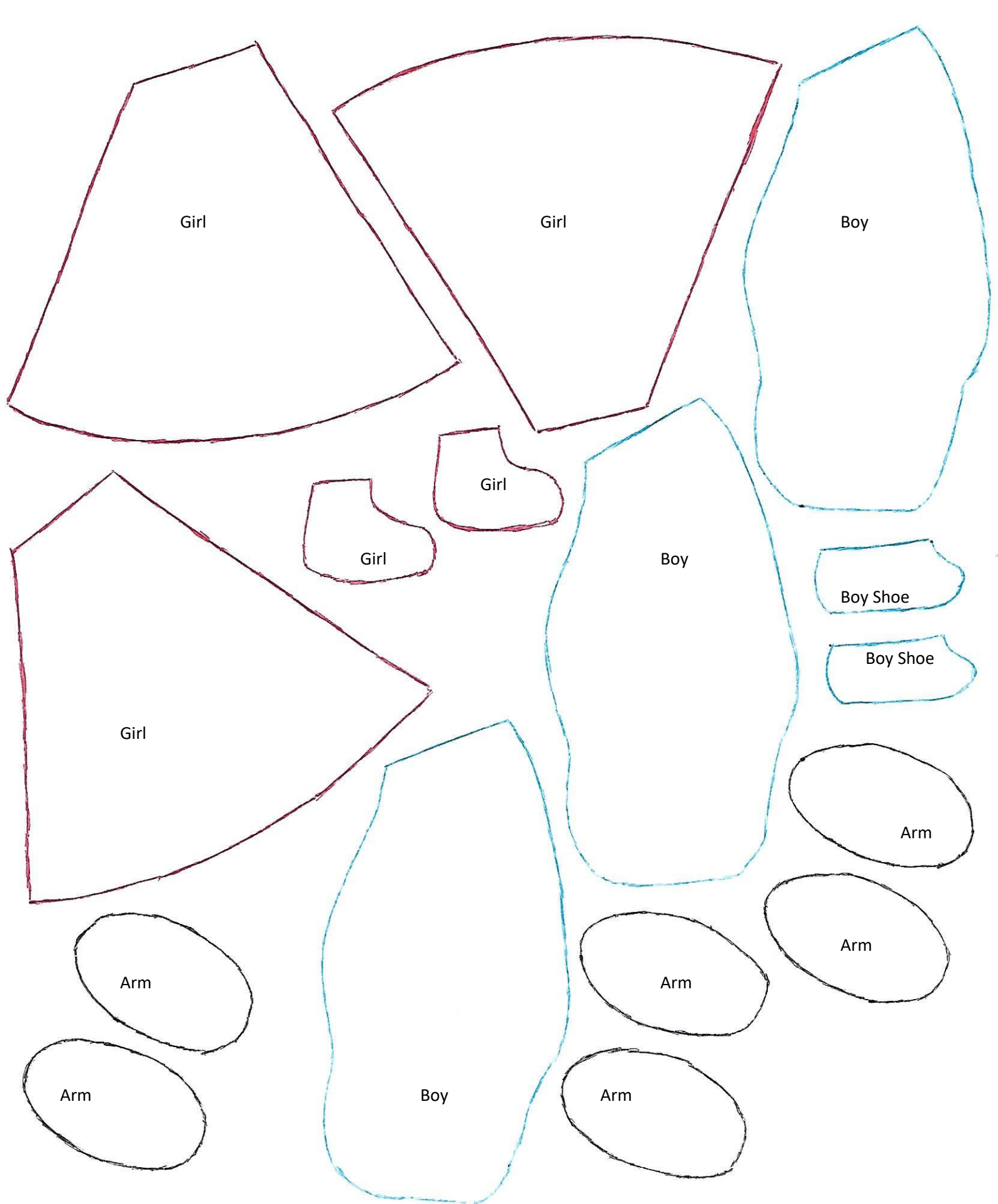
Optional: If you are going to make the Sunbonnet Quilt (a block of the month quilt via Quilt Block Mania), sew the border on the 12 ½” x 12 ½” block prior to appliqueing.


For the border you will need two (2) 2 ½” x 12 ½” and two (2) 2 ½” x 16 ½” strips of fabric coordinating with the block. Sew the 2 ½” x 12 ½” strips onto the sides of the quilt block, press as desired. Sew the 2 ½” x 16 ½” strips to the top and bottom of the block. The block measures 16 ½” x 16 ½”.

2. Trace the templates onto the paper side of light fusible web. Rough cut the pieces apart. Lay the pieces on the backside of the appropriate fabric and fuse according to manufacturer directions. Cut out on the drawn lines. Arrange Sue and Sam to your satisfaction on the background 12 ½” x 12 ½” block. Following the manufacturer directions, fuse the fabric pieces to the background.


Secure the pieces by stitching on the outside edge of the pieces. You can use a running stitch or try your hand at embroidery stitches such as the blanket, backstitch or vine stitch.

Note: The graduation cap and arms are the same for the boy and girl. When positioned as designed, there is only a need for two boy and two girl feet. Have fun and embellish with your alma mater colors!
